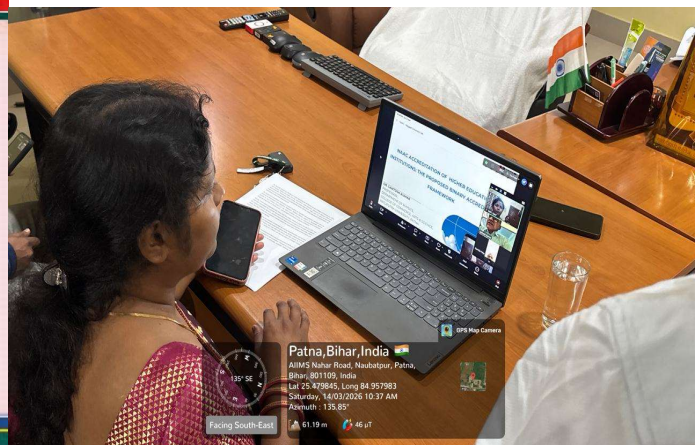

Sessions Conducted

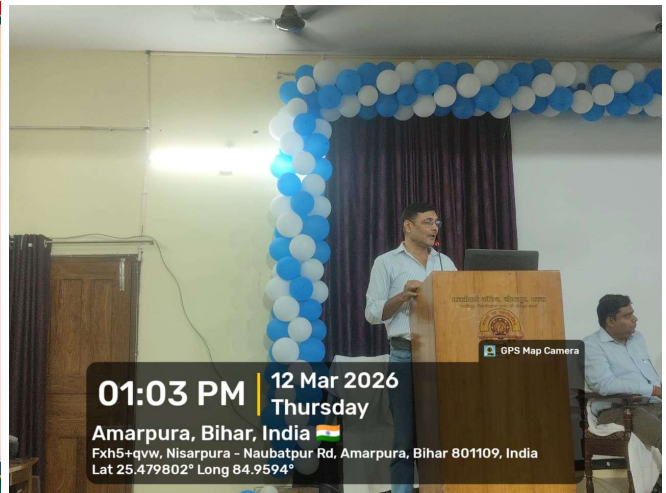

FDP-301:
